Executive Session.

The City Council will hold an executive session under N.D.C.C. Section 44-04-19.2, pursuant to N.D.C.C. 44-04-19.1(3) to seek or receive the attorney's advice regarding internal complaints and in anticipation of potential adversarial proceedings, and also the attorney's advice and guidance on the legal risks, strengths, and weaknesses of the various methods of conducting an investigation. See N.D.C.C. § 44-04-19.1(5). Under N.D.C.C. 44-04-18.1(6), records relating to a public entity's internal investigation of a complaint against a public entity or employee for misconduct are exempt until the investigation of the complaint is complete, but no longer than seventy-five calendar days from the date of the complaint.
